

SWORD OF BUNKER HILL CONFERRED FOLLOWING REUNION



Following the conclusion of the August Reunion, Sam Davis Order No. 125, Sword of Bunker Hill, held a conferral of that Order on 47 candidates. Sword of Bunker Hill is a patriotic and historical Order whose purpose is to highlight the contributions of Masons during the American Revolution, to promote interest in Masonry and encourage attendance, and to create a social and fraternal organization that will perpetuate the principles of liberty. The ceremony is referred to as an order rather than as a degree, and local bodies are also known as Orders. Members traveled from Smyrna, Tennessee, to confer the Order. The candidates came from not only Tennessee, but as far away as Charlotte, North Carolina and Daytona, Florida. A portion of the money raised from conferral fees is used to support Rainbow and DeMolay, as well as the Tennessee Masonic Widows' and Orphans' Fund, Shriners' Hospitals, and the George Washington National Masonic Memorial.


